Twenty-year-old Noupoort resident Lilitha Pansti has proved otherwise by launching the town's very first modelling school. With our support, she has transformed her passion for modelling into a platform that empowers young people to build confidence, develop new skills and discover opportunities they may never have imagined.

We funded Lilitha's training ahead of the Mr and Miss Noupoort Junior modelling competition, covering event costs, and connecting her with mentors from local business and data professionals. The event brought together learners from Eureka Primary, Ikhwezi Lokusa Primary, and Noupoort Combined Primary, offering a vibrant platform for young talent to shine.

“Through modelling, I gained confidence, discipline, and self-expression. I wanted to create the same opportunities for young people in Noupoort.” - Lilitha.

Looking ahead, Lilitha aims to train more than 100 young people from the community over the next five years .

Congratulations to Sinegugu Tshona, a proud Noupoot graduate who is turning academic success into entrepreneurial ambition. With support from our bursary programme, he is building a strong educational foundation while taking exciting steps towards becoming one of the community's next generation of young business leaders.

Awarded the bursary in 2025 during his final year at Walter Sisulu University, Sinegugu completed his Diploma in Financial Information Systems with 11 distinctions. He is now furthering his studies through an Advanced Diploma in Cost and Management Accounting.

With financial pressure eased, Sinegugu has been able to focus on innovation, launching two business ventures, which have earned him national recognition, including a top-25 placement in the TuksNovation Standard Bank Fintech Challenge and selection into the Impact Nexus Cohort 2025.

Printers for Noupoot Schools!

We donated printers to three local schools, helping teachers prepare and share essential learning materials more efficiently so they can spend more time focused on teaching and learning.

The printers were delivered to Enoch Mthetho High School, Ikhwezi Lokusa Primary School, and Noupoot Combined School, following feedback from School Governing Bodies on the challenges caused by limited access to printing. With printers now in place, the schools can produce materials on demand, cutting costs and delays, and giving teachers more time to focus on teaching.
