INS IS CARING FOR COMMUNITY CHILDREN & ELDERLY

Since the beginning of the COVID-19 health pandemic, almost 100 children, who are enrolled in the INS aftercare programme, have been receiving food parcels each month.

SUPPORT FOR CLINIC

Noupoort Wind Farm is working with the District Department of Health, to fund Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) to help keep local frontline healthcare workers at Eurekaville Clinic, Nonqo Simon Zono Clinic and the Noupoort Community Health Care Centre safe.

The wind farm will also purchase medical equipment that can be used post COVID-19 to treat asthma and tuberculosis patients, within Noupoort community.
