COMMUNITY HEALTH SUPPORT


Noupoort Wind Farm has extended its support to local health facilities, a Eurekaville Clinic and Nango Simon Zono Clinic.

Water tanks and solar water geysers have been installed, in addition to other support.

The water tanks provide water during the daily water rationing measures, implemented by the Umsobombvu Municipality, due to a water shortage in the area.

Funding for essential COVID-19 medical equipment has also been provided.

This includes External Defibrillators and CPAP (continuous positive air pressure) machines, which have shown positive results, helping to reduce lung damage and allowing the patient to recover from the inflammatory effects.
