# IMPROVED WATER ACCESS FOR NOUPOORT RESIDENTS

Noupoort residents will soon have more reliable water access thanks to our new solar-powered initiative addressing water shortages from power outages, load-shedding, and cable theft.

In partnership with the **Umsobomvu Municipality** and **Envusa Energy**, three municipal boreholes and the main reservoir will be upgraded with solar pumps and remote monitoring. This will reduce reliance on traditional electricity and provide a more consistent water supply.

Led by Impact Water Solutions and supported by local company, Mabcor Facilities Solutions, the project will also create jobs for eight Noupoort residents and is set for completion by mid-June 2025.

## AGRICULTURE TRAINING EQUIPS FARMERS

In collaboration with Business Ezone Ventures and the Department of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development, we recently provided essential training to 16 local farmers.

Over four days, this Integrated Farm Planning and Management Course training focused on veld management and farm planning, addressing key challenges such as poor rotational grazing practices and outdated farm infrastructure.
