Building Up Young Entrepreneurs in Noupoort

Earlier this year, we welcomed 15 bright young minds into our entrepreneurship programme, hosted at the Noupoort Hub.

Hosted over three days, the programme focused on sustainability and business development, equipping participants with practical tools, from business planning and budgeting to pitching and renewable energy insights.

The programme concluded with a pitching competition, where participants presented their business ideas to a panel of judges. The top three winners each received a R1,000 grant to kickstart their businesses.

Local Emerging Farmers Empowered!

In partnership with the **National Development Agency,** we supported a week-long co-operative training programme benefiting 30 local farmers, including the newly formed Emntla Koloni Farming Co-operative.



This initiative focused on building governance and compliance skills to support sustainable farming and local economic growth. Participants, many of them women and youth, received training on NPO and tax legislation, cooperative governance, e-filing, and annual returns.
